



\*New stations must have a platform gap no more than 3 inches wide and 5/8 inches high according to The Americans with Disabilities Act. But the United States Department of Transportation says on its Web site that for most commuter and intercity rail stations, meeting the requirement "is likely to be infeasible."

# MEASURING THE GAP

A team of Newsday staffers measured gaps at some LIRR stations. The railroad then issued a report detailing the widest gaps found at their major stations. Here are the results.



## THE FIGURES: NEWSDAY'S AND THE LIRR'S

Three days after Natalie Smead died at the Woodside station on Aug. 5, Newsday reporters began measuring gaps at various stations and continued through December. Reporters found some gaps as large as 15 inches. The LIRR, meanwhile, had never measured gaps until September, under orders from the National Transportation Safety Board. Newsday obtained those measurements in December. This chart includes both the LIRR's measurements of 40 stations and those taken by Newsday. These stations represent more than 75 percent of the railroad's daily ridership. N/A indicates measurements were not taken.
